Water at the Summit Bechtel Reserve

Water at the Summit Bechtel Reserve is not only plentiful but is important in the sustainability of the property. Here are a few ways we not only use but conserve and recycle water on property. A few facts about water at the Summit and the 24th World Scout Jamboree

• To protect the environment and conserve water usage

- o Rainwater run off the Summit has a network of 60 acres of swales and rain gardens to treat runoff by filtering it through plants. This is designed to help prevent excessive runoff and erosion.
- o Low flow fixtures cut typical water consumption in half, these fixtures are used in both the sinks and the showers throughout the Jamboree site.
- o Water is stored in a 2 Million Gallon Tank and a 6 Million Gallon Tank to provide fresh and readily accessible water for the World Scout Jamboree.
- o Hydration Stations encourage reusable water bottles.
- Gray water systems (Water that has already been used)
- o Composting Toilets are used to help support sustainability.
- o Gray water from showers and sinks is recycled to be used to flush toilets.
