CLIMBING

 When it opened in 2013 The Summit boasted the largest man-made climbing facility in the world. Climbing activities include bouldering, traditional top-rope, and auto-belayed climbing, rappelling (abseiling) and the Leap of Faith. These take place at two locations, The Rocks, and Boulder Cove. Both are inspired by the popular climbing routes in the nearby New River Gorge and hand sculpted to resemble the natural rock of the region.

THE ROCKS

- The larger of the two climbing venues at The Summit, The Rocks is located in Adventure Valley and features:
 - 6 Free-standing boulders
 - o 72 Top-rope climbing stations
 - 35 Auto-belay climbing stations
 - o 30 Rappelling (abseiling) stations
 - o 6 Leap of Faith lanes

BOULDER COVE

- Located in the Summit Center, overlooking Goodrich Lake, Boulder Cove packs plenty of climbing adventure into a smaller space.
 - o 3 Free-standing boulders
 - 24 Auto-belayed climbing stations
 - o 12 Rappelling (abseiling) stations.
