Before you start your day, there are a number of items that you and your patrol should carry in your daypack. These are called "Safety Essentials." These items are:

Depending on your plans for the day, you may want to carry other items such as insect repellent and extra snacks. Some items may be shared between your patrol members, such as sunscreen or hand sanitizer — make sure to discuss with your friends who is bringing what before leaving. Packing all the items you need in your daypack will keep you prepared for a fun-filled day.

Heat Advisory: Drink lots of water. Follow the water intake guide. Seek water, shade, rest, and if needed, visit medical tents to cool off.

Area Evacuation: Everyone should avoid or move away from the area as quickly as possible and head towards the stadium. Watch and make way for Emergency Vehicles.

Base Camp Muster / Directed Headcount: A mandatory check-in has been directed. Everyone should notify their unit leader or staff area leader of their location and status. Return to your Base Camp and await further instructions.

Illness or Injury: Your health is very important. If you feel sick, unwell, or become injured, talk to a doctor or nurse in your own language at your Base camp or at program areas across the jamboree.

Feeling Unsafe? Feeling Unhappy?: At all times during the jamboree, you should be completely Safe From Harm. Every adult is required to take training before the jamboree to make sure youth and adults are protected. If you feel unsafe or feel that someone has harmed you, please contact your unit leader, another adult, or the WSJ Emergency Phone Number at 304-465-2900.

Remember, a patrol shares the weight of equipment. Listening Ear is here to share the weight of a patrol throughout the site, manning checkpoints around Summit Center and located in the Trading Posts. They are here for your safety. Be sure to say "Hello!"

As a participant and a Scout at the 24th World Scout Jamboree, I agree to obey all United States, Virginia, and local laws, as well as the following Code of Conduct.

I am aware that I am a representative of the Scout Movement and will follow the Scout Law at all times during my travel and jamboree participation.

I will be respectful, tolerant, and considerate of other cultures, including dressing appropriately for a multicultural environment.

I will obey safety rules, signs, and instructions by unit leaders and other adults.

I will follow the jamboree sleep schedule, unless otherwise directed by the jamboree program, by remaining in my campsite and respecting quiet times.

I understand that during the jamboree the purchase, possession, or consumption of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs is prohibited.

I understand smoking is only permitted in marked areas and not allowed in tents. (Legal age is 18 years or older).

I understand that gambling of any form is prohibited.

I will avoid serious behavior issues including dishonesty, fighting, and bad language.

I will respect other participants' property and refrain from "trophy hunting".

I will keep the jamboree and my personal site clean and follow recycling policies.

I will wear my jamboree neckerchief and jamboree ID at all times unless to remove them for safety.

I will comply with all elements of the Safe from Harm program to prevent abuse and harassment.

I will only trade patches and souvenirs with my peers and will refrain from selling any items.

I will comply with all access restrictions and will not enter private tents or sites unless invited.
