## Jamboree Flash Update

### Day Visitors at the Jamboree

If you are not able to attend the 24<sup>th</sup> World Scout Jamboree as a participant, perhaps you might consider instead joining the Jamboree as a day visitor. Below are some important pieces of information for day visitors to the Jamboree.

- Day Visitor passes – Day visitor passes are **now on sale and available for purchase**
  - Tickets are sold for a single day and are valid for that day only
    - Adult single day pass (age 14 and older) \$55 USD
    - Youth single day pass (ages 6 – 13) \$30 USD
    - Youth under age 6 No charge
  - Purchase tickets using a credit card
  - Visitors will be issued a wrist band which must be worn throughout the visit; a new wrist band will be issued each day
  - Note that the 24<sup>th</sup> World Scout Jamboree **does NOT provide transportation to the Ruby Welcome Center**, nor is there on-site housing available for day visitors to the Jamboree

    - **Note: the activities at Action Point and Boulder Cove, such as skateboarding, mountain biking, and climbing, are reserved for Jamboree participants**
    - Although day visitors will be precluded from participating in the recreational activities open to Jamboree participants, they will be able to observe Scouts in action in these areas as well as benefit from the numerous displays and exhibits depicting Scouting around the world
    - Day visitors are not permitted to visit base camps or sub camps (Scout living areas) or recreational areas outside Summit Center/Centro Mondial
    - If you want to meet with your sons or daughters, you should arrange a time and location within Summit Center/Centro Mondial (e.g., by the trading post) to meet up with each other
- Travel
  - Day visitors will begin their Jamboree experience at the [J. W. and Hazel Ruby Welcome Center](#), located in Mt. Hope, WV on US Highway 19.
  - West Virginia is a rural area, and most hotel rooms near the Jamboree will be reserved by groups supporting the Jamboree operation
    - Anticipate a one- to two-hour travel time to and from the Jamboree each day
    - The 24<sup>th</sup> World Scout Jamboree does not provide transportation to or housing for day visitors on the Jamboree site
- Be Prepared
  - The Jamboree covers a large area, most of which is covered by either grass or large gravel, and both heat and rain are always possibilities in West Virginia
    - Wear footgear appropriate for walking outdoors over ground that is not completely level
    - Be prepared for rain by bringing along your rain gear
    - Ensure you remain hydrated; bring along, fill, and use a water bottle
  - **All sales are final**
  - Review your selections carefully as no refunds will be issued due to
    - Erroneous product selection or quantity
    - Weather
    - Change of schedule
    - Change, suspension, or cancellation of activities
    - Failure to arrive at the venue
